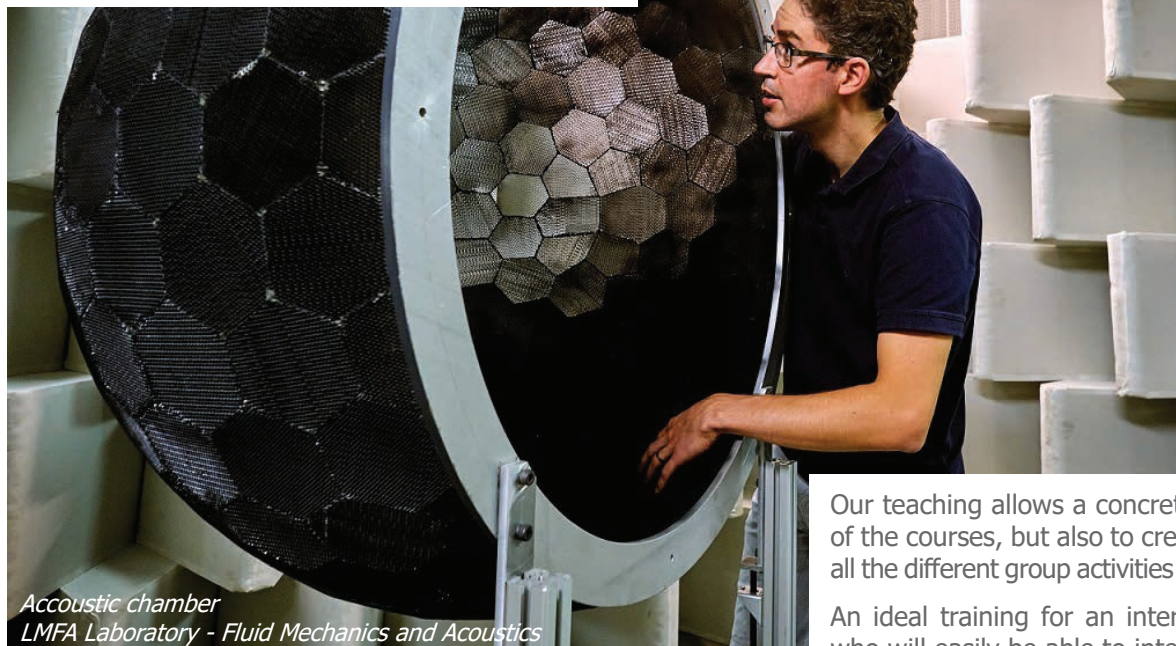

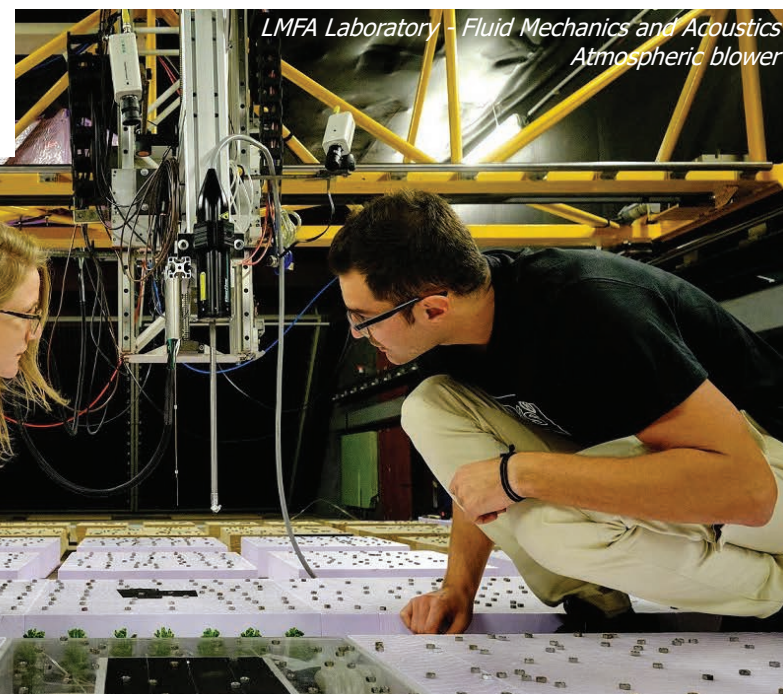

The École Centrale de Lyon is located on a 17 hectare campus with a wooded and green landscape. A bubble of nature close to the very active and vibrant city of Lyon!





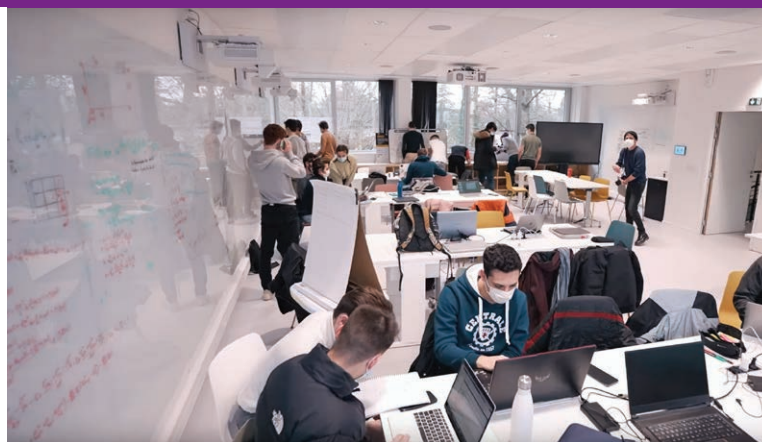
You will have access to many student facilities and services at the École Centrale de Lyon!

Sport is an integral part of the life of the School

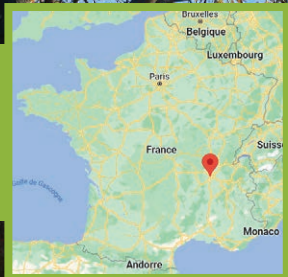
The campus offers access to various facilities: A gymnasium with a climbing wall and a weight room, four outdoor tennis courts, a stadium, a football pitch and a rugby field.



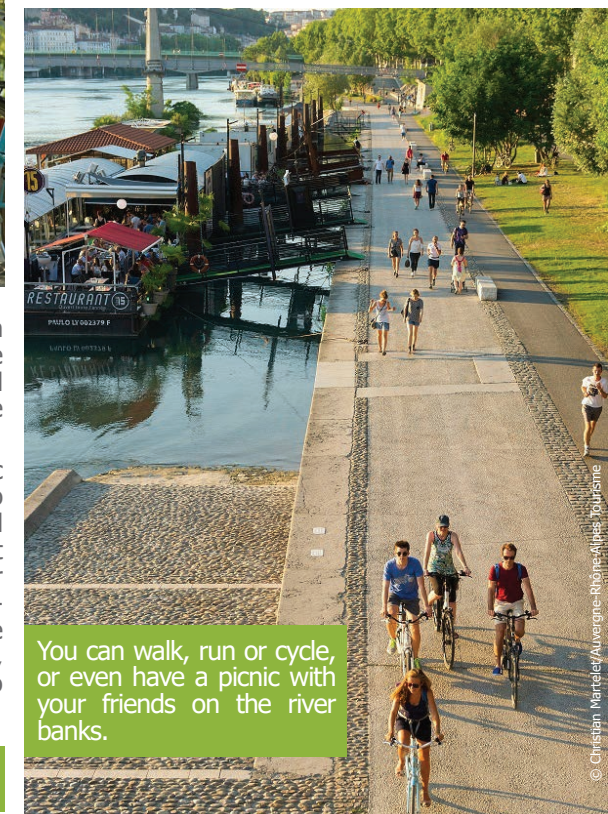

Lyon is a pleasant city. Rich in architectural treasures, the «Old Lyon» district is classified as a Unesco World Heritage Site!

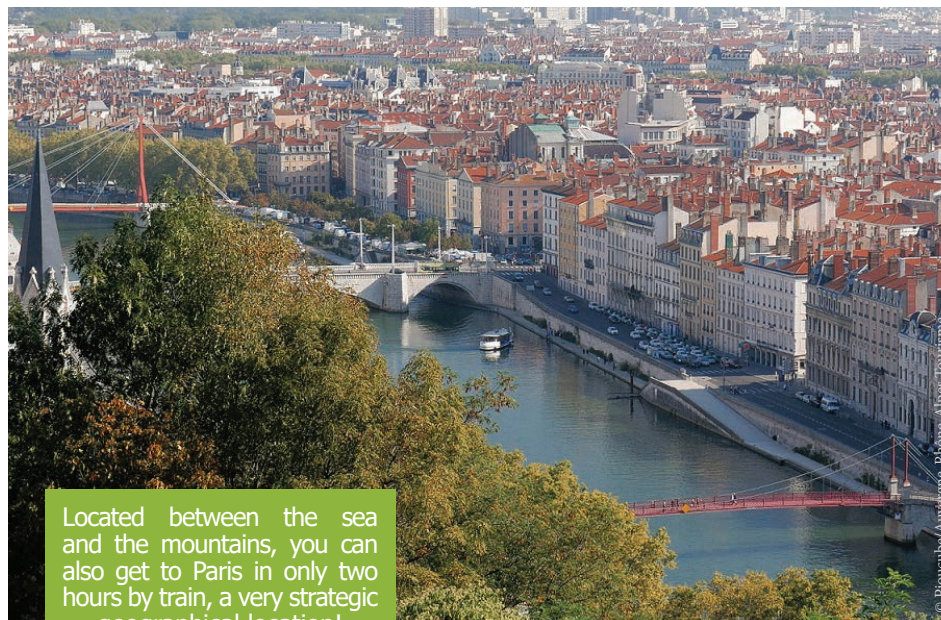

Located between the sea and the mountains, you can also get to Paris in only two hours by train, a very strategic geographical location!

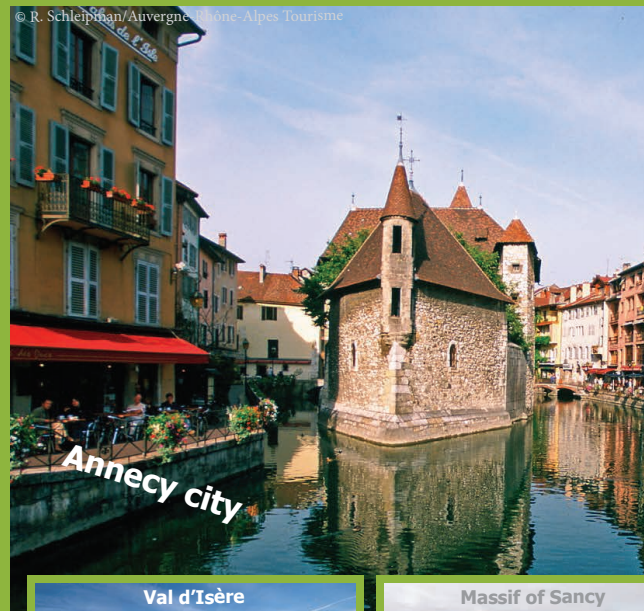

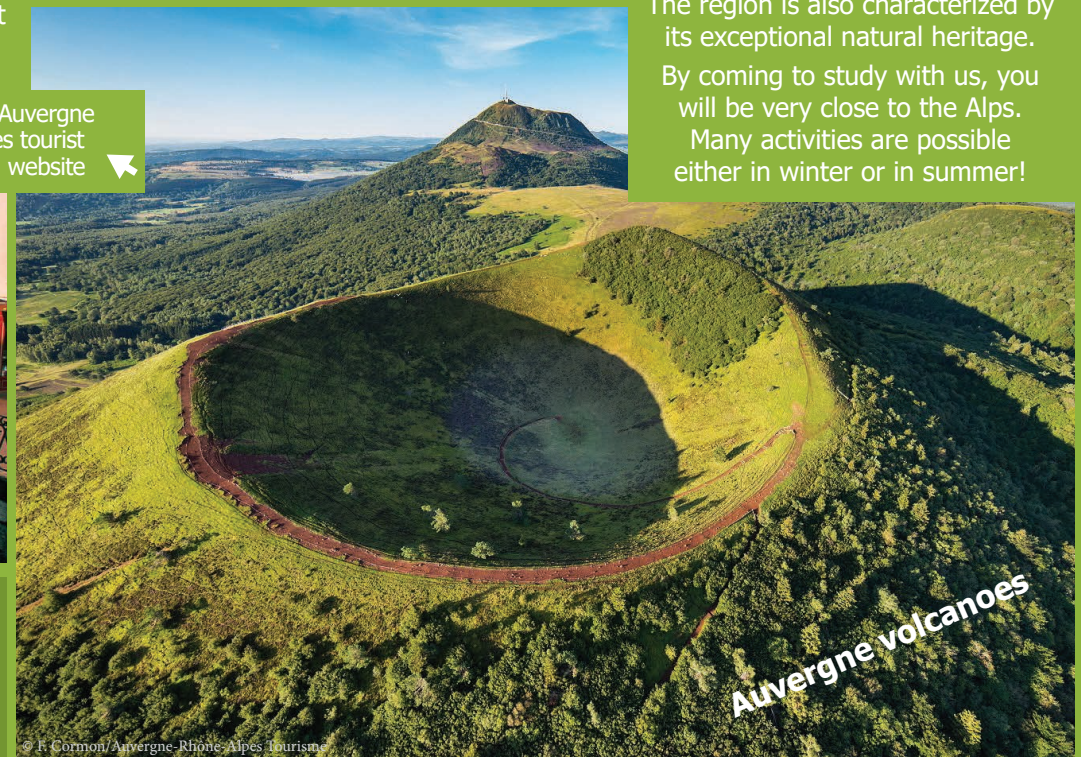
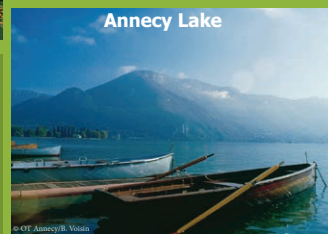

Financial support

Scholarships

There are many scholarship offers that can help you finance your stay. However, applications for this must be submitted before your arrival. Please contact your Home University to have more information on this.

Part-time jobs

To finance your studies, you can work part-time, up to 964 hours per year, i.e. 60% of the legal annual working time in France (except for certain visa requirements). There are also a limited number of job opportunities on campus.

Housing subsidies

As a student at the École Centrale de Lyon, you are entitled to a housing allowance. This amount depends on your income. You can simulate the procedure on the [CAF's website](#) («Caisse des Allocations Familiales») and check how much you may approximately receive.

Paid internship

During your training, you may be required to complete an internship. This can be paid under certain conditions, and can therefore bring you additional financial support. The placement must be in France and last at least two months. The hourly rate is at least €4.05 per hour of internship, i.e. about €567 for a full month at 7 hours per day. Insurances

Health and travel insurance

If you do not have the European Health Insurance Card (CEAM) when you arrive in France, or the RAMQ form (for Quebec), you must register on the [Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie \(CPAM\)](#) website for your health insurance coverage.

Your medical expenses will not be covered until you are registered with the CPAM. We therefore recommend you to have a travel health insurance before your departure to cover the first month of your stay.

Please note that the CPAM reimburses approximately 70% of your expenses (within the limit of the regulated rates). It is therefore strongly advised to subscribe to an additional «mutuelle» for additional coverage (especially in the case of a hospitalisation). Some insurance companies offer good rates for students.

«Responsabilité civile» insurance

The «responsabilité civile» insurance is mandatory for all students and is used to cover physical and material damage caused to third parties. This insurance can be included in other insurances (such as the one you subscribe to for your accommodation which is also compulsory). It is therefore important for you to look into this in detail in order to avoid unnecessary additional costs.

Repatriation insurance

We advise you to take out repatriation insurance for the duration of your stay before your arrival in France. Some bank cards include repatriation insurance, check this with your bank before you leave.

Obtain your VISA

If you are not a citizen of the European Union, Monaco, Andorra or Switzerland, you will need to apply for a student visa.

You will probably obtain a VLS-TS visa, which is valid 4 to 12 months, depending on the duration of your stay. This visa can be renewed if the duration of your stay is longer (for Double Degree Students for example).

Within three months of your arrival, your student visa must be validated. You will be accompanied by the International Relations Department, and the full procedure will be explained on your arrival.



What budget for your arrival?

Prepare a budget before you arrive as several expenses will be incurred on your arrival. Ideally, in order to be comfortable, we suggest you plan a budget of around 2000 euros.

Rent and deposit

If you are staying in the student halls of residence. On your arrival, you will have to pay the rent for the month of August as well as the full rent for the month of September. A deposit of 500 euros will also be requested. In total, this will cost you between 1000 and 1500 euros depending on the halls of residence you've chosen.

Memberships

The BDE (*Bureau Des Élèves*), will offer you several memberships at the beginning of the year:

- Membership to the **AEEL** (*Association des Élèves de l'École Centrale de Lyon*), as well as to the **USEEL** (*Union Sportive de l'École Centrale de Lyon*), enabling you to be part of an association (see page 7-8).
- It is strongly recommended to also join the «**pack poly du SDeC**» (*Service Des Cours*) « association. By joining, you will have access to several printing facilities such as your lecture notes sent to you or your internship report bound or even having the possibility to print A0 format posters.
- **The WEI** (*Weekend d'intégration*): This is up to you to decide whether you wish to take part in this weekend or not. It is the occasion to meet the other students and make new friends. The cost is about 130 euros.

In total, on top of your rent and deposit, you will pay around 540 euros if you decide to sign up to these different associations.

Furthermore, the associations also sell goodies if you wish to treat yourself!

What budget for your daily life?

During your stay with us, you will face a multitude of expenses for food, for going out, for your leisure... The etudier-en-france.net site gives an average estimate of the cost of living in France, on housing, bills, food, leisure... do not hesitate to consult it.

Welcome week

A welcome week is organised at the end of August for our international students. You will arrive one week before all the French students in order to facilitate your installation and get your administrative procedures out the way.

If you pick a room on campus, the Bureau International will interview you on your arrival to find out who you are and what you like, in order to assign you a room in the building and on the floor that suits you best.

Transportation

Transportation out of Lyon



« Carte Avantage Jeune » (Travel pass for young people).
For people aged between 12 and 27 years old. This can be bought for 49 euros on internet or at the train station. It gives you a 30% discount on train tickets during one year. One way Lyon-Paris : average 45 euros with the «carte avantage jeune». Check the [SNCF website](#) for for this travel pass.

Transportation in Lyon



In Lyon, the transportation is managed by the TCL agency. One ticket is 1.90 euros. For students between 18 and 27 years old, you can have a subscription at **25 euros per month**. This gives you the right to use the metro, buses and streetcars in the whole agglomeration! Check the [TCL website](#).

Getting to the École Centrale de Lyon by public transport

The campus is served by bus lines C6, C6E, 3 and 55.

Approximate travel time :

- From the Perrache train station: about 30 min.
- From the Part-Dieu train station: 30 to 45 minutes.
- From Lyon Airport : about 1h30.

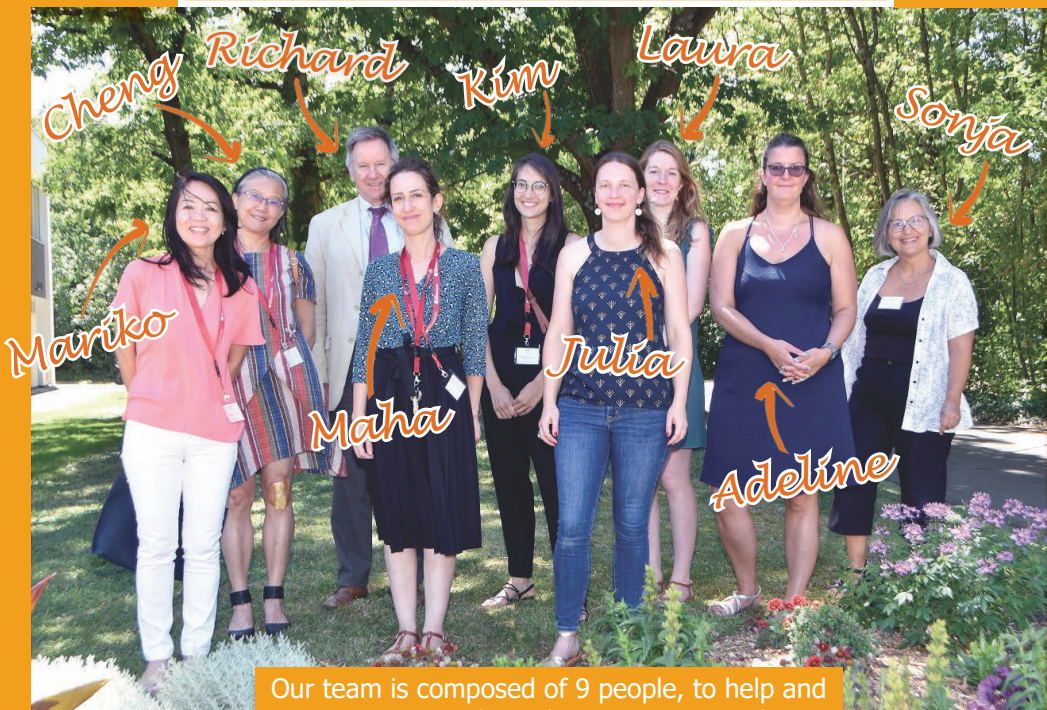
